We are confident that CFA has many years ahead of us to continue offering our students a rich academic environment, a wealth of opportunities, and an abundance of care.

The 2021 – 2022 school year at Cape Fear Academy was a remarkable one in so many ways. It gives me a great sense of pride to share with you some of my reflections on a year that will be viewed by many as transformational for our school.

We began the year with record enrollment of 715 students and, while we continued to endure many challenges related to the pandemic, we pulled together as one tight-knit community and saw it through to the end. It was one of my great joys to see our students' and teachers' bright, smiling faces when they were able to come to school without a mask for the first time in nearly two years.

We witnessed the return of many time-honored traditions: the Kindergarteners' live performance of "The Mitten," Middle School overnight trips in the spring, and Upper School artists of all types wowing us with brilliant performances. On the athletic fields, CFA attained our highest ranking ever in the Athletic Directors Cup, being named the second best overall athletic program in the NCISAA Division 3A on the strength of multiple state and conference titles.

We celebrated the Class of 2022, with graduates admitted to 128 different colleges and universities. These incredible students won a number of national academic awards and earned over \$1.5 million in merit scholarships.

This year also saw us taking financial steps to build upon our commitments to academic excellence and rich extracurricular activities both now and in the future. Alongside our record-setting Annual Fund, we raised more than \$4 million through our Be The Next campaign and also purchased 11.4 acres of land immediately adjacent to our main campus.

None of this would be possible without the long standing support and philanthropy of our generous benefactors, who, for many years now, have given unselfishly of their time and financial resources.

With the continued commitment and care of our brilliant faculty and staff, the fortitude and grace of our amazing students, and the dedicated and ongoing encouragement of our generous parents and friends, we are confident that CFA has many years ahead of us to continue offering our students a rich academic environment, a wealth of opportunities, and an abundance of care as we advance our mission in meaningful ways.



VARSITY VOLLEYBALL

RECEIVES SIXTH NATIONAL ACADEMIC AWARD



For the sixth consecutive year, the CFA Varsity Volleyball team earned the United States Marine Corps/American Volleyball Coaches Association Team Academic Award. The award, initiated in the 1992-93 academic year, honors volleyball teams that maintain a year-long grade-point average of 3.30 on a 4.0 scale or 4.10 on a 5.0 scale.

CFA's team GPA was in the top 20% of the 425 high school girls athletic programs receiving the award, and they were also recognized as a Team Academic Honor Roll school for the fifth straight year. Only four schools in North Carolina earned the Team Academic Honor Roll designation.

ARTS | CREATIVITY IN COMMUNITY

any families have a refrigerator or corkboard covered with their children's artwork, but it was a special day in April 2022 when the Cape Fear Academy Arts Department opened the Boney Courtyard, McNeill Fine Arts Center lobby, and several rooms in the Beane Wright Center for Art Day, a retrospective show featuring drawings, sculptures, and more from students spanning all our divisions.

Conceived by Lower School Art Teacher Elizabeth Lineberger and Middle School and Upper School Art Teacher Lisa Rojek, planning for Art Day began even before anyone knew if guests would be allowed on campus. Still, Lineberger and Rojek hoped and planned for a group art event that would invite parents into the art classrooms and allow students to showcase their creative work.



Rojek traditionally hosts an annual viewing and reception with her AP Art students, but for Lineberger, putting together a show with a year's worth of work from nearly 300 students in Grades 1 through 5 created some intriguing possibilities and new challenges. "I thought it was important to teach kids how an art show is put on," she said. She developed a plan to teach students every facet of putting together an exhibition, from creating, storing, and displaying the works to training as docents who could talk knowledgeably about the various artworks.

In the weeks leading up to Art Day, Lower School students learned how to choose their show pieces from the many works they had created over the year. They wrote labels, matted and hung drawings and paintings, chose tables and platforms for sculptures, and prepared talking points to share with visitors.

In addition to viewing artwork with student guides, Art Day included interactive opportunities for visitors to explore artwork, books, and artist biographies that classes had studied. Lineberger also created stations where families could create their own art together, which she observed was very special and enjoyed by everyone.





BIG WINS RESULT IN STATE CHAMPIONSHIP

aturday, October 30, 2021 was a crisp fall afternoon when the Cape Fear Academy Varsity Girls Tennis Team traveled to Kinston, NC to take on the #1 seed Arendell Parrott Academy (APA) Patriots in the NCISAA 3A State Championship. Despite playing on Parrott's courts in front of a fired up home crowd, the CFA team was looking for the upset after falling to Parrott 5-4 early in the season.

The Hurricanes knocked off APA 5-4 on that day to clinch the state title, ending the year with a 14-2 record and the program's sixth state championship. Playing against the undefeated APA team, Co-Head Coach Alex Gianapolous noted that it took every player's best effort to secure the victory. CFA had been the state runners-up in 2020, which provided extra motivation for the 2021 state match.

Led by All-State and All-Conference players Liza Wells '24 and Julia Johnston '22, who was also named the conference Player of the Year, the team included three other All-Conference picks (Tyler Beacham '24, Taylor Garriott '26, and Elle Harmon '24) as well as two honorable mentions (Isabel Bellamy '23 and Blythe Crocker '25).

The season included big wins over Hoggard HS, Rocky Mount Academy, St. David's, St. Mary's, and Carolina Day. "At the time we had a young team and they showed great resilience all year playing some tough schools. Towards the end of the year they were not afraid to show their energy and passion and they fed off that emotion in a positive way," said Gianapolous.

Co-Head Coach Lauren Isenhour and Assistant Coach Paula Sneeden rounded out the coaching staff, with Gianapolous and Isenhour sharing the Coach of the Year Award.

VARSITY BOYS LACROSSE

CAPS OFF TOUGH SEASON WITH CHAMPIONSHIP

The Cape Fear Academy Boys Varsity Lacrosse Team defeated Forsyth Country Day School to claim the NCISAA Division II Championship. Playing in Concord, the team won with a score of 9-7, finishing the season with a 12-6 record.

After an aggressively scheduled early season and several heartbreaking overtime losses, the team started the season with a 1-5 record. However, Head Coach Paul Gilbert recognized that the team was solid, and they set a goal to improve as a team in each practice and game.

Under the leadership of senior captains Cam Arne, Gavin Bahner, and Owen Johnson, the team then went on a hot streak, winning nine of the next ten games and heading into the playoffs confident they were at their best.

In a very spirited semi-final game, CFA hosted arch rival Southlake Christian, winning by a

goal. Heading into the championship game, CFA faced another familiar and tough adversary in Forsyth Country Day School.

In the high-scoring event, Nick Spanola earned the offensive MVP award, hitting net three times (including the game winner), and Cameron Arne was made of iron, clearing the ball and setting up the team's offensive plays. On defense, Owen Johnson made several valuable saves in the cage, while Grant Underwood held FCDS's strongest player and biggest offensive threat scoreless.

"In the end our conditioning was the difference, and even though FCDS had a highly touted team, we out ran and out played them," said Gilbert.







s a graduate of Cape Fear Academy who benefited from financial assistance while attending the school, the decision about where to focus her donation was easy for Emily Hall Poole, Class of 2008, and her husband, Greg Poole. The Pooles generously committed \$350,000 to support need-based financial aid at Cape Fear Academy. With this gift, Poole hopes that giving back to Cape Fear Academy will enable others to enjoy the same experience she did.

I ended up graduating from CFA with a high GPA, unbelievable lifelong friends and acceptance to the college of my choice, all of which I am forever grateful for."

Having personally experienced the way Cape Fear Academy can transform a student's relationship with learning and their life, Poole wanted to help provide that opportunity for future students.

"I believe strongly in the importance of paying it forward and investing in the next generation." she said. "More than anything, I hope that it gives someone an opportunity and that the opportunity changes the trajectory of their life in a constructive manner, and that they make a positive impact on the world in some way."

BUILDING STRENGTH TOGETHER

s Hurricane Larry spun past the East Coast in September 2021, Grade 3 students at Cape Fear Academy gathered on the floor of their classroom with clay, popsicle sticks, tape, and construction paper. Their task? Design and build a house that would keep occupants safe and dry during a hurricane.

In Third Grade, Makerspace is an integrated part of the curriculum that weaves throughout various topical studies. It's a time when students are given open-ended challenges and then encouraged to create a solution using research, experimentation, and teamwork. The hurricane-proof houses activity coincided with science lessons on the environmental forces of wind, rain, and gravity.

Over the course of the study, students researched what makes a house strong and watertight. They quickly identified that during hurricane conditions, it would be very challenging to keep water from seeping into a structure through the joints and connections. As a result of this realization, students drafted plans ranging from houses on stilts to cylindrically-shaped buildings.

"Of course, the part of this activity students enjoyed most was when they put the house to the test!" explained teacher Elizabeth Lallathin. Using a watering can and fan, they started creating "Category 1" hurricane rain and wind conditions, gradually increasing the intensity until each house met its stormy demise.

Students worked in groups and were encouraged to meet challenges by testing and revamping their ideas. When a house didn't work out like they had planned, they were encouraged to ask "why," and then make and implement a new plan. Students were also inspired by examining what worked for others groups and consider how they could integrate that knowledge into their own strategy.

Lallathin says, "The ideas of persistence and finding growth in failure are the grandest objectives in Makerspace." So, while the forces of nature may have triumphed over all their house designs, the overall lesson is something that will stand with our students throughout their education and beyond.

urious, creative, and confident are three adjectives frequently used to describe *I* both Cape Fear Academy students and teachers. Bringing these qualities together results in engaging, impactful activities like the Ocean Cafe that transformed Rebecca Wells's 8th Grade Science classroom last March.

Middle School is a development stage when students take increasing ownership in their education, which Wells emphasizes in her teaching style. "I love it when students are active collaborators in their learning!" So during a deep dive into their unit on oceanography, she proposed the idea of a coffeeshop-style open mic session, where students would present their research in creative ways.

The Ocean Cafe influenced how I saw the ocean in many different ways. Through the cafe projects, I learned a lot about creatures. areas, and objects in the ocean. I also learned what pollution is constantly doing to our ocean and am now more aware of the things we can do in our everyday life to prevent it.

Wells acknowledges that although she provided the kernel of the Ocean Cafe idea (along with coffee and biscotti), the students are the ones who really brought it to life. "Some people did stand-up comedy; one pair ran a game show, like a trivia night. Another group decided to be the cafe servers — serving up knowledge along with pieces of a cake they decorated." Other highly entertaining and informative acts included a puppet show, a Bob Ross-style painting tutorial, and an original song.

Libby Wells '26, who worked with Alex Zakszeski '26, remembers how much they enjoyed the artistic freedom to decide the method with which to share their information. "We were

both really passionate about the project and felt we could use our creative skills to put together a fun performance for our peers." The pair researched various oceanic zones and wove that knowledge into a real-estate themed skit where Wells played the role of a mermaid (tail included!) looking to purchase a new home.

Students appreciated the collaborative energy as well. "I enjoyed working as a team while learning about the different layers and environments of the ocean. I also enjoyed seeing the creativity of the different presentations," says Eden Rienks '26.

The practice of choosing topics, carrying out research, and planning presentations as a group is key in preparing students for future success, says Wells. "This is part of trying to get them ready for jobs that don't even exist yet: giving them life skills to be able to collaborate and work towards a solution with anyone. The Ocean Cafe is a perfect example of them doing that."

UPPER SCHOOL

ONE DAY MADE A DIFFERENCE



The transition to high school can be daunting, but the Class of 2025 faced the extra challenge of doing it during the COVID pandemic. Having spent the final months of Middle School in remote learning, their preparations for 9th Grade were experienced through the constraints of social distancing, online classes, and virtual meetings done from home. Stepping onto campus and into their first classes in Cameron Hall in the Fall of 2021. these students faced steep social, emotional, and educational learning curves.

So while CFA's class trips always play a vital role in building community spirit and individual character, the Niners Bald Head Island Trip that October could not have come too soon for this group of students!

Computer Science teacher Carr Fullagar was one of the trip chaperones, and remembers the heightened feeling of anticipation as they gathered for the early morning departure to BHI. "These students hadn't been together in person as a large group in a long time. That, and being out in the community again, created a sense of excitement that you could feel when they got onto the ferry. They were just excited to be on a boat and to be together for the day."

The schedule included both structured activities and free time, allowing students to develop their sense of independence and autonomy. Part of the day was dedicated to letting the students roam the island by bike, deciding where they would go and with whom. They explored the beaches, relaxed under trees, or rode along the waterways, experiencing the beauty of the area at their own pace and developing relationships along the way.

Students also spent time learning from local experts with the Bald Head Island Conservancy, gaining knowledge that both deepened their understanding of the region in which they live and integrated with biology classes at CFA. "I think it was a powerful moment as the kids found more appreciation for where they live than they had before," says Fullagar.

For the teachers chaperoning the trip, it was also a chance to get to know the students more deeply in a fun, informal setting where they experienced new opportunities and challenges. Fullagar notes that the group activities were a time when some students started to evolve and be recognized as leaders, characteristics that carried back into their activities at CFA.

While it was just a one day experience, the Niners BHI Trip encapsulated the ethos of CFA's Upper School curriculum and student life goals, and students returned to campus better prepared and encouraged to take on new challenges as the Class of 2025.

espite going to one of the most competitive business schools in the country, Genna Zimmer '10 says that high school at Cape Fear Academy was hands down the most difficult academic experience she has been through.

"I was the student involved in everything: Student Government Association, athletics, in the plays... I wanted to do all the AP classes, I wanted to do everything! It was stressful at times, but being involved in so many things at Cape Fear Academy sets you up so well for the future."

During high school Zimmer also worked parttime at REEDS Jewelers, a store founded by her grandfather after WWII. Zimmer's grandfather was an active leader in the Wilmington community and among the first business leaders in the city to provide credit to minority groups, and as Zimmer considered her future career options, she was interested in continuing the remarkable legacy of this family business.

After graduating from Cape Fear Academy Zimmer went on to complete her Bachelor of Science degree in Business Administration from UNC Chapel Hill's Kenan-Flagler Business School. She credits high school peers with helping through the rigorous application process that entailed, including friends who reviewed

her essays and resume. "Going back to those contacts I had from Cape Fear Academy helped me succeed in college."

Zimmer began a career in corporate finance and accounting at Belk, but quickly felt REEDS Jewelers calling her home. In 2015, she completed a project management certification through Duke University, and then rejoined the REEDS Jewelers team as a project manager for their e-commerce and IT initiatives.

With the encouragement of the REEDS Jewelers Board of Directors, Zimmer returned to school at the University of Pennsylvania's Wharton School of Business. Completing a course that included independent study in China and attending Global Business Week events in Finland and Sweden, she graduated with a Master of Business Administration in 2020.

Currently, she serves as the Vice President of Operations and Strategy for REEDS Jewelers. She is responsible for home office operations and ensuring that the corporation is headed in the right strategic direction. Zimmer is passionate about keeping her grandfather's legacy alive, and helping a 76-year old business that was founded based on a love of people to flourish and remain current for many generations to come.



2022 / BUILDING FOR THE NOW AND THE YET TO COME

n a beautiful evening in March 2022, more than 200 parents, alumni, and friends gathered on the Turf Field at Cape Fear Academy for the All-Weather Get-Together. It was Cape Fear Academy's first large social gathering since 2019, and attendees could feel a special excitement in the air as they got the chance to celebrate together in person.

The purpose of this event was to celebrate our Be The Next campaign, a fundraising initiative representing the opportunity to define the school's facilities and programs for the coming years and decades, ensuring Cape Fear Academy can live out its values and deliver on its mission for every child.

"For decades, the children of Cape Fear Academy have experienced an education made possible through the generosity of CFA's close and caring community," explained honorary campaign co-chair, former Board of Trustees Chair, and alumni parent Bill Squire. "Past donors have invested their time and resources to support Cape

Be the Next invited parents, family members, and friends of the school to invest in three farreaching goals that have both immediate and long-term impact:

- Growing Cape Fear Academy's unrestricted endowment, enabling the school to expand financial aid, increase professional development opportunities, and build a stronger foundation for long-term financial stability
- Updating facilities and the Upper School STEM curriculum to establish community spaces and enhanced learning environments
- Building the Annual Fund into a more significant source of revenue that supports CFA's incredible enrichment programs

More than \$4 million has now been pledged for the Be Next Campaign, and Cape Fear Academy already benefits from this generosity. The Annual Fund has grown by 41%, and beyond simply strengthening the general endowment to its target amount, two additional endowments were created

For today's students and those still to come, we must continue this tradition of generosity and ensure Cape Fear Academy remains fully equipped to discover and develop individual potential in every child."

to expand access to a CFA education (the CFA Diversity Financial Aid Endowment Fund and the CFA Financial Aid Endowment Fund), while a third newly-created endowment (the Mack D. Webb '20 and Raney H. Webb '22 Endowment Fund) supports enhanced learning experiences in the Fine Arts, English, and History departments.

The most visible impact, however, is apparent as soon as you set foot inside our two main classroom buildings. Godwin Hall, home to our Welcome Center as well as most Lower School and Middle School classes, received a facelift, bringing a bright, clean appearance to the oldest building on campus and making updates to modernize security features. Cameron Hall, where the majority of Upper School classes take place, was extensively renovated, with a dramatically revamped floor plan on the main level to create a common area, meeting room, and several new STEM classrooms.

Physics and Engineering Teacher Ed Naessens now teaches in a state-of-the-art classatory, a large, bright room lined with whiteboards essential for drawings and computations. Featuring adjustable-height wheeled desks, the space provides important flexibility as it is rearranged to accommodate student learning styles and various project needs.

An added benefit is the connected storage room, where Naessens organizes what he refers to as "the toys." Having this space makes it easier for him to prepare the equipment needed for various laboratories that can be quickly moved in and out of the classroom, enabling him to teach a wider variety of subjects without significant set-up time. "There is no doubt this classroom aids in the students being able to learn more and learn better," he says.

Across the hall, Keni Rienks agrees. "The opportunities and flexibility to adapt and rearrange classroom space sparks curiosity in the students, setting them up to inquire not just about what they will learn but also how they will learn it." This engaged learning environment is not a happy accident, but the outcome of Rienks's deliberate input into the design throughout the entire process of creating her classroom space. From the placement of counters, cupboards, and sinks to the tables and chairs purchased, her specific class needs and desires as well as advances in pedagogy factored into every decision.

When not in the classroom, students often gather in the new Commons, a window-lined room with a variety of tables and chairs perfect for working on individual assignments or hosting club events. This space quickly became central to the Upper School community as a comfortable hangout spot, while the adjacent Boardroom provides a more formal space for meetings and workshops.

One further project, for a portico outside of Cameron Hall, is still in the planning phases. By funding these campus renovations, along with the programmatic opportunities resulting from financial stability and the enrollment access created through increased financial aid, the Be the Next campaign will continue to enhance our school community in ways both obvious and subtle for generations to come.
